## *What's in a name?*

The names of places are very often tied to their history. Some cities may be named for their founders, while others may be named after existing cities. Many cities in the United States, for instance, as similar to cities and towns in England, but have been prefixed with 'New': York becomes New York, for example.

In Australia, while some place names relate to settlement and are British in origin, others are names from Aboriginal languages handed down by Indigenous Australians. Often, settlers adopted the existing Indigenous name for a place rather than changing it to something else.

A place name with its roots in Aboriginal Australian languages immediately links that place to Indigenous history; that is, the area was populated and known to Indigenous Australians before settlement.
